California's Proposition 65 ("Prop 65") or the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, was enacted to protect California citizens and the State's drinking water. California created a list of over 900 chemicals that they determined are "known" by the State to cause cancer and other reproductive harm or birth defects. We believe the Prop 65 list of toxic chemicals, are all prohibited by one or more of these international organizations. In addition, there are some chemicals prohibited by these organizations that are not on the Prop 65 list. Texpak's products do not require Prop 65 warning labels.
